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

## Aurora Medical Center – Washington County Turns 100

The Aurora Medical Center – Washington County celebrated its centennial this year. This small, but mighty, community hospital has come a long way from its humble beginnings. It began in 1916 when Helen Lohr, a registered nurse, organized an eight-bed infirmary in the Old Kissel Boarding House. The hospital changed names several times over the last century. In 1926, it was purchased by an order of nuns and became known as St. Joseph’s Hospital. Eventually an offer was made to sell the hospital back to the community, and in 1971 it changed to Hartford Memorial Hospital. The hospital affiliated with Aurora Health Care in 1993 and was able to capitalize on the many resources available throughout the healthcare system. Today the hospital serves thousands of people in the community through all different services including wound care, cardiovascular and pulmonary rehab, sleep studies, interventional radiology, outpatient surgery, pain clinic, IV therapy, adult respite care, emergency, and inpatient services.

One of the benefits of a smaller community hospital is that they know their patients on a more personnel level than those of larger hospitals. When asked what the benefit of a small, community hospital versus larger hospital was, Amy Boettege, Director of Surgical Services said, “We know we are making a difference in the lives of people within our community. Also, you know who your people within the hospital are. Instead of going through a hierarchy on a phone list, with one phone call I can have the Vice President of Nursing or the VP of Physicians on the phone.” The smaller structure in community hospitals allows patients, nurses, and doctors to bypass the “red tape” that is often tedious in larger facilities and spend more time focusing on patient care.

The hospital has made several improvements to both the services offered and the building itself in recent years. The hospital boasts renovated inpatient rooms as well as a fully renovated outpatient surgery center, hiding around the back of the hospital. In 2014, Aurora Medical Center – Washington County unveiled it's finished Healing Garden. This beautiful addition to the hospital is available for patients, families, and caregivers to get a breath of fresh air and relax in the beauty of nature. The Healing Garden features a gorgeous sculpture in the center. It is a wonderful place to relax and heal both the mind and spirit.

Aurora has showed its commitment to the Hartford community by investing in the needs of their patients. Things such as investments into new state-of-the-art urology equipment, a new pain management physician and pain clinic, new telemed services for Infectious Disease and Behavioral Health consults for inpatients, and a new Interventional Radiologist are just a few of the ways that Aurora has invested in the needs of the Hartford community.

Aurora has continued to serve the community by not only investing in services that are offered but by committing to offer the same quality care found at larger hospitals with the convenience of the Hartford location. In 2015, the hospital was recognized for the fourth year in a row by The Joint Commission\* as a Top Performer on Key Quality Measures including

pneumonia, immunizations, surgical care, and venous thromboembolism prevention. The hospital is also 1 of only 14 hospitals in the state to be Joint Commission certified in hip and knee total joint replacements.

These, along with improvements to the building itself, have propelled the hospital to be a top performer in Patient Service Quality - the scores that patients give to the hospital. Aurora Medical Center – Washington County has consistently led not only the Aurora System in service quality scores, but has consistently been in the top quartile for hospitals nationwide.

The Medical Center Foundation of Hartford is another way that our hospital gives back to the community. The Foundation, as it is often referred to, is committed to improve the availability and quality of healthcare provided by the Aurora Medical Center - Washington County by raising funds for new programs and needed services which benefit the patients and the communities we serve. Just a few of the programs and services that are funded through the Foundation are personal emergency response services which connects elderly and disabled people in the community to a 24 hour service seven days a week, medical transportation, which gives discounted rates on both the Hartford Taxi or the Washington County Shared Ride Taxi to any Aurora facility in Washington County, adult day services which offer respite care for families of loved ones who are suffering with dementia, The S.A.N.E. Program, which is a program that offers special training for nurses to help with not only evidence collection but emotional support for victims of sexual assault, and The Fitness Program which is a program offered to community members to heal with professional trainers. The Medical Center of Hartford Foundation is just another way that Aurora as a whole is able to give back and serve the Hartford community.

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
